## IsoWhite<sup>TM</sup> Pterygium Surgery Post-Operative Instructions

- 1. Your eye will be patched after surgery. You will have your patch removed the first day after surgery by your doctor.
- 2. It is normal to have some foreign body sensation after surgery. **Do not rub your eyes.** It is normal for the eyes to be red. This will get better week by week and in 3-4 weeks is usually mostly gone.
- 3. As long as you do not rub your eyes, you can do all of your normal activities.
- 4. Medications should be used as follows unless otherwise indicated:

Pred Forte (Prednisolone 1%): 1 drop four times per day – shake up before using. → You will need to use four times per day for four weeks THEN it can be tapered down. For the fifth week, use it three times per day; the sixth week, two times per day; the seventh week one time per day; then stop. Note: You will need to **refill** your prescription during this time.

<u>Tobradex</u>: 1 drop four times per day.

Neomycin-polymixin B-dexamethasone ointment: put inside eye before bed Tobradex drops and the NPD ointment do not need to be refilled. You can stop when they run out.

Tylenol/Advil/Motrin as needed for discomfort.

Wait at least 15 minutes between using different drops.

- 5. Please bring your medications with you every time you see the doctor.
- 6. You may shower the day after surgery. Do not get soap or water in your eye for the first week. Do not wear eye make-up for two weeks. Normal exercise can be done as soon as you feel comfortable to do it.
- 7. For emergencies, contact Drs. Klein & Scannapiego at **908-289-1166**. Remember redness, pinching and irritation are normal after pterygium surgery.
